



The King of Instruments speaks Jan Kraybill, Organist

Jan Kraybill

Jan Kraybill is Principal Organist for the Dome and Spire Organ Foundation at the international headquarters of Community of Christ in Independence. Missouri, and Organ Conservator at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts in Kansas City. She regularly plays and oversees the care of the three largest pipe organs in the Kansas

City metro area: the Community of Christ Auditorium's 113-rank Aeolian-Skinner (installed in 1959) and Temple's 102-rank Casavant (1993), and the 102-rank Julia Irene Kauffman Casavant (2012) at the Kauffman Center's Helzberg Hall. She will perform on the beautiful Roy Johnson Memorial Pipe Organ, one of the finest organs in the city of Tucson.

Kraybill has performed in many venues in the U.S., Canada, Germany, Poland, Russia, South Korea, and Tahiti, and has undertaken multiple tours of the United Kingdom, including organ concerts at the grand cathedrals of Chester, Exeter, and St. Paul's in London. She has performed on regional and national conventions of the AGO, the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada, and other musicians' organizations, and has been featured on Kansas Public Radio and American Public Media's nationally broadcast program *Pipedreams*.

Her performances have been described as amazing, fantastic, marvelous, and magnificent. The Kansas City Star said this:

"As principal organist at the Community of Christ, Jan Kraybill has been dazzling music lovers for years with recitals on the mighty Aeolian Skinner organ in the Community of Christ auditorium."

She will perform music from the 17th to the 21st centuries including compositions by Buxtehude, Vierne, Dupré and Dave Brubeck.

ANNUAL SHOWCASE RECITAL A HUGE SUCCESS



Three members of the Southern Arizona Chapter, AGO, were joined by three local musicians for an exciting and diverse annual Showcase Recital at Grace St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Tucson, Sunday, November 24, featuring the church's III/58 pipe organ and other instruments.

Ji Sun Lee, director of music at Lutheran Church of the Risen Savior in Green Valley, played Duruflé's *Prélude et Fugue sur le nom d'Alain*. Then at the piano, she played two *Danzas Argentinas* by Ginastera. Dennis Grannan, chapter Dean and principal organist at Catalina United Methodist Church, collaborated with percussionist Barbara Freischlad, harpist Rebecca Foreman, and drummer Tyler Jones in presenting (respectively) Cochereau's *Boléro on a theme by Charles Racquet*, Grandjany's *Aria in Classic Style*, and Johannes Mathias Michel's *Swing Five (Erhalt uns, Herr)*. Woosug Kang, director of music at St. Philip's in the Hills Episcopal Church, rounded out the program with Widor's *Allegro (Symphony no. 6)*, New Zeelander Douglas Mew's *Gigue de Pan*, and Australian Thalben-Ball's spectacular *Pedal Variations on a theme by Paganini*.

The audience left wowed by the wonderful and amazing sounds of the organ and collaborating instruments, all so colorfully and excellently executed. A reception followed in the parish hall.






