
David Gay, sub dean, presents the organs of Southern Arizona from the time of the Gadsden Purchase until now in a PowerPoint presentation that is sure to entertain as well as to increase our knowledge of the organs of our area from territory times. This promises to be a terrific program!

David has done considerable research on this project and unearthed organs many of us know nothing about. One of those featured will be the 1903 Murray Harris organ at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Bisbee. This instrument has recently been restored through the interest and support of the congregation and it may be the second pipe organ in Arizona. It was only electrified in 1948. In addition to photos of a variety of instruments, the presentation will be accompanied by some audio recordings. This is a program you won't want to miss.







In Memoriam

Fred Fahrner (1930-2013)

A native Michigander and graduate of the University of Michigan in organ performance, Fred worked as an accompanist for the Detroit Public Schools. Over the course of 30 years, he played for over 7,000 weddings at the Henry Ford Museum, Greenfield Village, in the Martha Mary Chapel. Fred was a member of the Detroit Federation of Musicians, and a longtime dual member of the Detroit and Tucson AGO chapters. He was also a member of the Guild of Carilloneurs in North America. He is survived by Anne, his wife of 32 years.

Ken Josephson (1967-2013)

Son of longtime chapter members Chuck and Joan Josephson, Ken's life was cut short accidentally as he traveled home to visit his parents. He enjoyed music, traveling and working with his parents at their business, the Print Well. He was a caring, giving person who sought to bring joy to others.

Mundt, Willis Philip (1931-2013)

Willis, who served in the Marines in the Korean War and who practiced medicine in Nebraska until his retirement to Green Valley, was active as a musician, playing piano, organ and handbells and singing in the choir at the Lutheran Church of the Risen Savior in Green Valley. He was also a member of the Green Valley Community Chorus for 22 years.






