"You can't retire from music. It's my life. A day without music is a mistake."

There is an old joke that goes: "Old musicians don't die. They just go from bar to bar". I doubt many of us older musicians go from bar to bar in the outside world, but I bet we do plenty of that in our musical worlds.

We were so fortunate to learn from Dr. Stephen Keyl's recent study tour in France. On April 15 at St. Alban's Episcopal Church, he discussed and presented the genres of early French organ music, and the sounds associated them, along with photos and other materials. Thank you, Steve, for taking that study trip and for sharing your experiences with us. Hospitality chair Dee Schultz served French delights after the presentation!

Jeffrey Campbell and Steve Keyl shared the bench of the Fritts organ at St. Alban's Episcopal Church to perform works by Buxtehude and Bach, the perfect instrument for the music of those composers. 

Annual Meeting Directions: There are several ways to get to the Colonia Verde club house:

- 1. From the Foothills, drive south on Sabino Canyon Road, through the light at Cloud Road. After crossing Tanque Verde Wash, you will pass three HOA's and then Sabino Baptist Church on the left. Immediately beyond the church, take the next left turn (E. Portal Airosa) into Colonia Verde. Drive one block, cross Camino Valle Verde into the clubhouse parking lot, straight ahead.
- 2. Tanque Verde to Sabino Canyon Road. Turn north onto Sabino Canyon Road. Turn RIGHT at the second street on the right (E. Portal Airosa) into Colonia Verde. Drive one block, cross Camino Valle Verde into the clubhouse parking lot, straight ahead.
- 3. North on Kolb Road (north of Speedway Blvd.), turn right onto new Sabino Canyon Road, cross Pantano Wash, proceed through Tanque Verde, then turn right at the second street on the right (E. Portal Airosa) into Colonia Verde. Drive one block, cross Camino Valle Verde into the clubhouse parking lot, straight ahead.
