Dr. Bálint Karosi has been Cantor and Director of Music, Classical at Saint Peter's Church in Midtown Manhattan since 2015. After winning the 2008 Bach Prize in Leipzig, Bálint has been in demand as a recitalist and clinician worldwide, known for the interpretation of Bach's music and his Baroque-style improvisations. His recording portfolio includes three albums by Hungaroton, including his original orchestral works, and thirteen albums of the complete works for organ by J. S. Bach.

Also known as a composer, Bálint has studied at the Liszt Academy in his native Budapest, Hungary, the Conservatoire Supérieure in Geneva, Switzerland, and at Oberlin Conservatory in Ohio. He earned his DMA in composition at the Yale School of Music. He recently joined the faculty of the Organ Department at the University of Michigan, where he will teach organ literature, church music and improvisation. Program information on page 4.

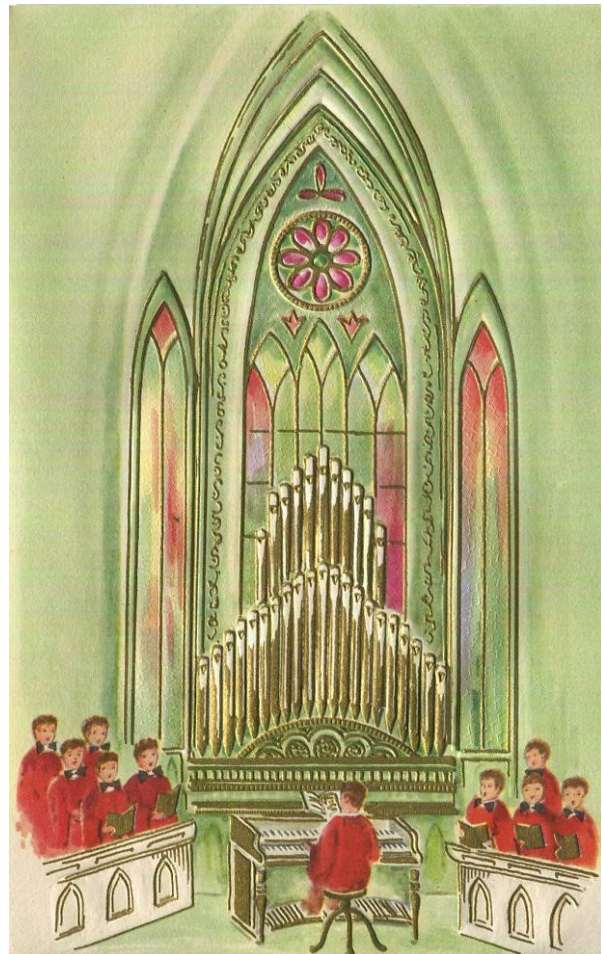

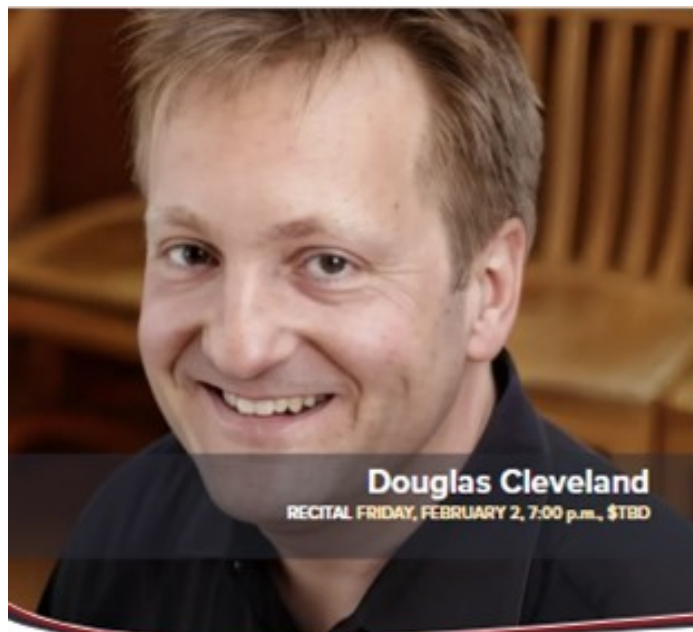
Roy Johnson Memorial Scholarship

- ♦ for collegiate level students, registration fees for regional and national conventions of the AGO
- ♦ for collegiate level students, full membership in the American Guild of Organists, Southern Arizona Chapter

Scholarship awards for organ study will range from \$350 to \$1500. For educational events, the scholarship will cover the cost of registration.

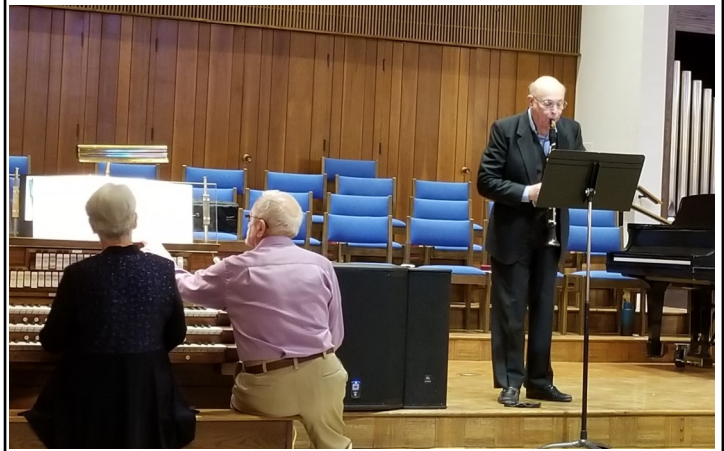

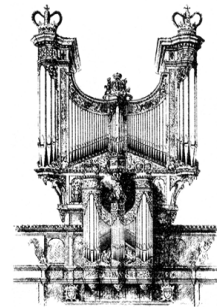
