




Roy Johnson Memorial Scholarship

Take Oracle Road north to Pusch Ridge Road. Turn left at the stop light.


Follow Pusch Ridge across the bridge over the wash and continue straight. It soon becomes Lambert Lane.


About a half mile on the right is Desert Springs, and just past the entrance for that, also on the right, is the entrance to The Highlands. (Watch for the silver fire hydrant).

Turn into the entrance onto The Highlands Drive. You'll see the Clubhouse and Pool area ahead.

Go straight past the stop sign and office, bearing left at the Y in the road, and park around the Clubhouse and pool area. The entrance to the clubhouse is on the left side of the building.







Chaplain's Message

The Rev. Canon David Benedict Hedges



As we turn the corner into the New Year, liturgical churches celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6, and follow it with a season sometimes called "Epiphanytide," lasting until Lent sets in on Ash Wednesday. (Happy Valentine's Day!) The most famous Epiphany story is that of the Wise Men arriving from the East with their three gifts.

They come not because they are waiting for the hope of Israel, but because they have seen something that makes sense in their foreign worldviews - the sign of a star. The feast of the Epiphany also celebrates Christ's Baptism, when the voice of God spoke to let people know who Jesus is. And finally the same feast also celebrates the Wedding in Cana, where Jesus wrought his first miracle, turning water into wine—amazing the guests and convincing his disciples that they were following someone special.

In all of these, the message is about who Jesus is. Wise people in foreign nations got the message, Jesus himself got the message, and his disciples got the message. As church musicians, your work is to use the gifts of sound and harmony to get the message across. It's not a decorative add-on to the service - church music is a part of the proclamation of the Gospel! The music we offer together makes it known, with and without words, that Jesus is Lord.

The organ in particular is such a great instrument for church music, not only because of its power and tonal character, and its suitability for leading congregational song, but because its resources, from the mellowest Koppel flute to the most bombastic contra-bombarde, can show us the range of human experiences of God - both God's gentle loving care for us, and his wrath at our destructive misuse of the grace and trust he places in human beings.

So let every hymn, every voluntary, every anthem, every note be an Epiphany for your hearers - a manifestation of the power and promise and love of God in Christ Jesus.



WURLITZER JOURNEY OF AMERICAN MUSIC FEB. 17, 2024
