message from the dean...



Dear Friends and Colleagues,

This is my first message as Dean, and the blank 'page' on my computer screen was quite intimidating at first! Writing isn't as easy for me as it used to be, or perhaps I'm just forgetting the effort in retrospect.

Using the computer does make the process easier though. Typing is much more effortless than using pencil and paper. Copy, cut, and paste make editing easy, and auto-correct gives the illusion that I'm a good speller. But the bottom line is that I just don't write much. My days of handwriting letters are long gone, and most of my communication is through texting. And when I text, I'm usually doing talk to text instead of 'typing' on the tiny cell phone 'keyboard.' I've learned though that it's important to proofread and edit my text messages before hitting Send. They will perform on the church's Æolian-Skinner organ, which is an excellent representation of the "American Classic" design. It was originally built for Christ Methodist Church in Cincinnati, Ohio, in 1959. St. Michael's purchased this instrument in 1989. In 1998, after repairs and upgrades were made, it was installed at St. Michael's. The organ has seen the addition of the Antiphonal division, as well as changes and additions to the other divisions. The completed instrument has been renamed the A. F. Schultz Organ, in recognition of Alan F. Schultz's many contributions to St. Michael's and the Tucson community.

Details regarding the performers and their repertoire, mostly Dupré, will follow in the October issue of the newsletter.

Members of the audience and performers can mingle afterwards at the reception hosted by SAAGO.

St. Andrew's has hosted an annual hymnfest since the present Möller pipe organ was installed in 2008. Lars Andersen has been the guest organist for this event since its inception. The three-manual Möller organ was built in 1949 for a church in Racine, Wisconsin. When that church closed, the organ was sold, dismantled, moved, and installed in the beautiful sanctuary at St. Andrew's in the fall of 2008.

The program features a massed choir from many churches in Sierra Vista, a high school choir, and robust congregational hymn singing.

Dr. Raymond T. Ryder, dean, teaches piano, class piano, Music Fundamentals, and Popular Music in America at Pima Community College as well as serving as Organist and Handbell Director at Desert Skies United Methodist Church. He is also a performing member of Sonoran Bells, the community supported professional handbell ensemble. In addition, he is a Past President and the Honored Teacher 2014 of the

Arizona State Music Teachers Association, as well as a Past President of the Tucson Music Teachers Association.

He holds degrees from the University of Colorado, the Florida State University, and the doctorate in piano performance from the University of Arizona where he studied piano with Rex Woods and organ with Roy Johnson. Raymond was previously on the faculty of Delta State University in Cleveland, Mississippi, and on the accompanying staff of the Interlochen Arts Camp for nine summers.

Laura Silva, CAGO, is happily retired after having served various churches as organist and/ or choir director in Richmond, CA, Richland, WA, and Columbus, OH, and has served as Dean of the Mid-Columbia (Washington) and Columbus (Ohio) AGO chapters. 

Roy Johnson Memorial Scholarship

Students may apply for a scholarship!

Established by the Southern Arizona Chapter of the AGO in memory of Professor Roy Andrew Johnson, the scholarship is available to assist in funding organ study as follows:

- lessons at any level through collegiate;
- introductory organ lessons for pianists;
- Registration fees for an educational event, including a Pipe Organ Encounter (POE);
- for collegiate level students, registration fees for regional and national conventions of the AGO.
- for collegiate level students, full membership in the American Guild of Organists, Southern Arizona Chapter.

Scholarship awards for organ study will range from \$350 to \$1500. For educational events, the scholarship will cover the cost of registration.

Alec Wyton

Organists to feature New York master

Alec Wyton, master of choristers and organist of the New York City Cathedral of St. John the Divine, will be featured next weekend in events by the Southern Arizona chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

All sessions will be at Grace Episcopal Church, 2331 E. Adams St., and are open to the public without charge.

Wyton will give an organ recital at 8 p.m. Friday.

After a luncheon for organists and clergy at noon Saturday, Wyton will conduct a workshop on church music for all attending the luncheon.

At 5 p.m. Sunday Wyton will conduct massed choirs from four churches in a festival chorus of Ralph Vaughan Williams compositions. Participating churches are Grace Episcopal, St. Francis Cabrini, Northminster Presbyterian and Catalina United Methodist.

At the concert, Dr. Roy Johnson of the University of Arizona music faculty will receive from Wyton an associate certificate of the American Guild of Organists.

Organists with roles in the concert include Roy Duran, Johnson and Mrs. Robert Burke. Fees will be charged for the Friday recital, luncheon and workshop.

A native of London, Wyton has two degrees from Oxford and is a fellow of the Royal Academy of Music. He came to the United States in 1950, is a past president of the American Guild of Organists and is head of organ department at Westminster Choir College.
