message from the dean...

Friends and Colleagues,

Thanksgiving Precedes Advent

Doesn't it seem a little odd that academic years and fiscal years are completely offset from calendar years? Yet for a church musician, the Liturgical Year begins with Advent. And then, as a teacher, the 'year' basically begins in the middle of August (even if my appointment book starts its year with the beginning of July), but I don't feel that the year really begins until the day after Labor Day. Any way you look at it, things are in full swing by the beginning of December.

For those of us in SAAGO, the 'year' has had an excellent start. Our opening meeting and installation of officers was in the setting of an evensong service at St. Alban's, with a nice variety of music featuring their baroque style instrument. A few weeks later, our Members Showcase at St. Michael and All Angels also showcased a more romantic instrument in a nice Spanish colonial architectural setting. The concert there a week later featuring the Fauré Requiem, was also excellent, and included not just the choir and organ, but other instrumentalists as well. Meanwhile, the Catalina Organ Festival, St. Alban's Concerts, and St. Philip's in the Hills Episcopal Church have all had their opening concerts for the season.

Thanksgiving gives us a few days to take a break from many of our activities. But also a break to reflect upon the musical events of the season so far and take a few deep breaths before plunging into Advent. For many of us the pace really picks up in Advent. Dozens of special musical events will celebrate the holiday season, many of them simultaneously. For me, ringing in Sonoran Bells is a great way to start Advent. We are celebrating the 25th anniversary of the group and are giving a concert in four different locations around the city the first weekend of December. My following weekend will be focused upon a Christmas cantata. And then, in addition to wrapping up the semester at Pima, more special services and concerts to attend will make December cheerful and busy.

New Year's Eve will arrive in a few more weeks, but by then it really seems like the New Year is already well underway. I'm looking forward to many additional events in the New (calendar) Year as the New (musical) Year continues. See you there...

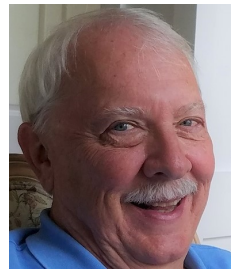


SAAGO—Mid 20th Century Organ Culture William Kuhlman

The 1960s and 70s proved fertile years for realizing the promises of the Organ Reform Movement in the building of organs as envisioned by Albert Schweitzer earlier in the century. Organ enrollment in the colleges and universities was high, and master teachers brought about a renewed interest in performance practice made possible by the "tracker" craze.

Professor Kuhlman will touch on a few of the builders and teachers of organ who were vanguards in realizing these "reforms" during these "golden" years.

In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, railroad companies used organ recitals to develop tourism and motivate people to ride the rails. Travel itineraries west to California often included a visit to the Tabernacle organ at Temple Square in Salt Lake City where there was a daily organ recital series. Other cities followed suit and organs became a status symbol of culture and refinement.

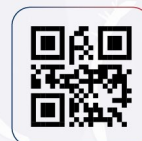

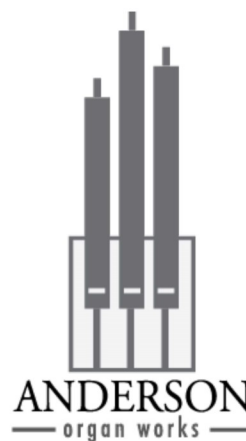

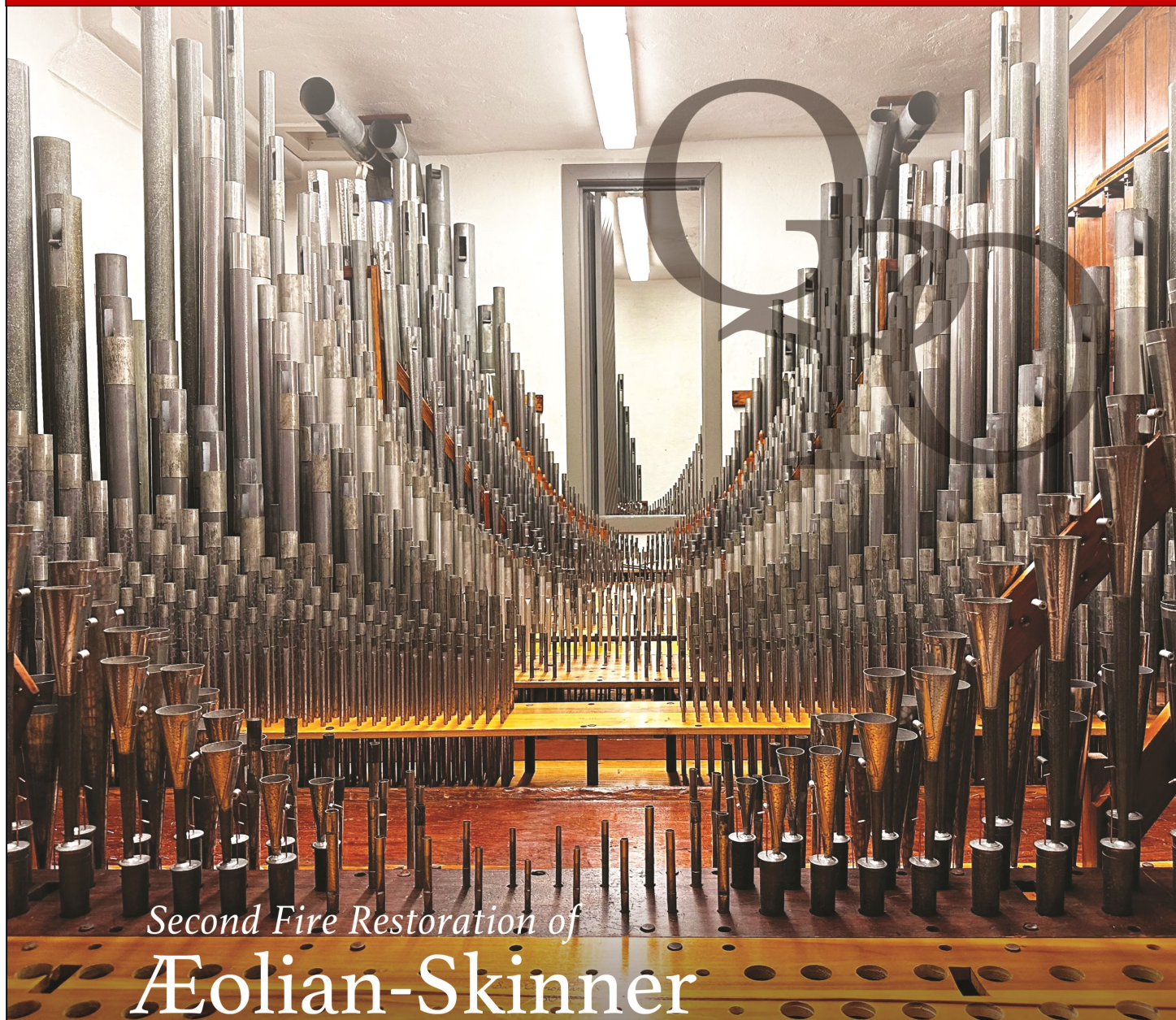
